Vaccination Information

- DAPP-L4: This core vaccination protects your dog against the following serious diseases. It includes the following:
 - Canine distemper virus: Affects dog's intestinal, respiratory, and neurological systems. Affected dogs can have permanent damage to their nervous systems. This virus is transmitted via discharge from the eyes and nose of affected dogs.
 - Canine Infectious Hepatitis: Can cause severe liver disease, eye damage, and respiratory problems that may be fatal. This disease is spread via infected urine.
 - Canine Parvovirus: This is an extremely serious disease that affects a dog's digestive system. It can cause bloody diarrhea, vomiting; it destroys the immune system and can affect the heart in puppies. It can cause death within 48-72 hours if untreated. This virus is spread through contact with infected dogs or objects.
 - Canine Parainfluenza: A potential cause of kennel cough. This disease is spread via contact with an infected dog's nasal secretion.
 - Leptospirosis: This disease can cause kidney, liver, and blood diseases. It can be spread through contact with infected bodily fluids (except saliva), and infected wildlife.
- Dogs should get 3 doses of the DAPP-L4 vaccine approximately 3-4 weeks apart. If there is too much time between boosters, it may not stimulate the immunity adequately. If this occurs, we may need to restart the vaccine series over to ensure full protection.
- Rabies Vaccination: This vaccination is required by law. It protects against rabies. Rabies is a fatal disease that affects the nervous system. It is passed through infected saliva usually during a bite.
- Bordetella: This vaccination protects against one of the pathogens that can cause “kennel cough” and is transmitted in the air. If left untreated, it can progress to bronchitis and bronchopneumonia.
- All vaccines need a booster after one year. After this, the Rabies and the DAPP-L4 can receive a three-year vaccination. Bordetella vaccines are always one-year vaccines.
